

If an adult son or daughter, a parent or another adult needs overnight care from someone who does not usually live with you and so you need an extra room. (You may find it useful to read out Factsheet on the Bedroom Tax before completing this).

A disabled adult lives in my house and requires an extra room because they need overnight care. The adult is called *(add name here)*

- Why the person needs overnight care - what are their health problems?.
- What is the care that they need in relation to their health problems at night?
- How often do they need the care?
- Who provides this care? *(Give the names of these people or if they are provided by an agency or the council the name of the agency or council.)*

To ignore the needs of a disabled member of my household and treating them as not being entitled to a room for a carer because they have overnight care needs is discriminatory and unlawful in relation to the Human Rights Act 1998.
